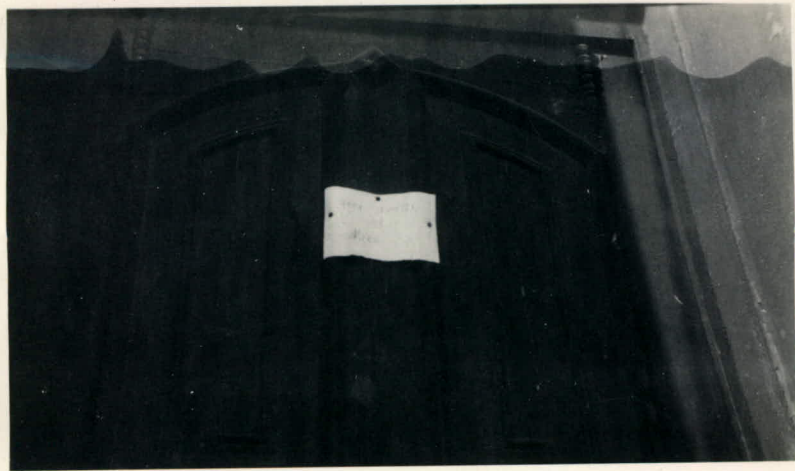
March, 1945
