The P. Frank (Philip Francis) Price Collection

Biographical Sketch

Dr. P. Frank (Philip Francis) Price was a noted missionary to China for over 50 years with the Presbyterian Church of the United States (Southern) and, with his wife Esther Wilson Price, was intimately involved with the Chinese people and the fostering of stronger ties between China and the United States. P. Frank Price was born in Richmond, Virginia on July 2, 1864. His father Philip Barbour Price held a pastorate in Richmond and his mother's family owned a plantation outside of Richmond name "Marion Hill." At the death of his mother in 1870, P. Frank's father moved to Rockbridge County, Virginia having accepted a pastorate at High Bridge Presbyterian Church. Young P. Frank split his time between "Marion Hill" with his Aunt Julia, affectionately called "Dudu," and High Bridge with his father. He attended Hampden-Sydney College from 1882-1884 and Union Theological Seminary, then attached to Hampden-Sydney, from 1886-1889. In 1889 the Presbytery of Montgomery ordained the Rev. P. Frank Price and the young minister carried out evangelistic work in western parts of Virginia until deciding to become a missionary to China in 1890 as a missionary of the Lexington Presbyterian Church. Reverend Price began his missionary work in Soochow. In 1892, P. Frank met and married Esther Wilson, a missionary who had been in China since 1888. Rev. and Mrs. Price worked in Kashing province until 1912 and later in Nanking from 1912-1941. Davidson College awarded Rev. P. Frank Price an honorary doctorate of divinity in 1908. Dr. and Mrs. Price had five children, Frank, Philip, Leighton (died 1903), Julian and Harry. Dr. Price served as a professor of systematic theology at Nanking Theological Seminary from 1912-1941. The Prices not only carried out evangelistic and educational work, but they also ran a medical clinic and administered the Good Samaritan Fund founded by Dr. Price in 1889 for the disadvantaged and destitute.

In addition to missionary work, P. Frank wrote a number of articles and pamphlets on China and the Chinese People including his tract The White Harvest Fields. Dr. Price founded and edited the Nanking: Notes and Notices publication that discussed local events in the Nanking religious community. Dr. Price served as moderator of the first meeting of the Church of Christ in China in 1922. On furloughs to the United States, Dr. and Mrs. Price spoke to thousands of people in talks and addresses on China. During one such furlough in 1936, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of the United States elected Dr. Price as their moderator for the 1936-1937 term. Dr. Price also served as co-chairman of the Nanking International Relief Association and as President of the China Christian Endeavor Union. The Prices lived in China during the first four years of the Sino-Japanese War and witnessed many of the horrors associated with Japanese rule. With his retirement from missions work in 1941, Dr. Price returned to the United States and made his home Florence, South Carolina. During his time in Florence, Dr. Price continued his correspondence and interest in Chinese affairs and published a weekly article in a local newspaper entitled, "Talks on Timely Topics." Esther W. Price died in 1950 after a prolonged illness. Dr. Price spent his last years at the McLeod Infirmary in Florence where he served as chaplain until his death on May 10, 1954.

The P. Frank (Philip Francis) Price Collection

Scope and Content

The P. Frank (Philip Francis) Price collection is arranged in series according to the type of material involved. These series include: General Materials, Religious Materials, Writings and Articles, Family and Funeral Materials, Miscellaneous Materials, a Postal Card Collection, the Circle Letter Collection, Sermon Notes collection, Journal Collection, and Diary Collection. The vast span of time which the collection covers (1869-1978) allows the research to see changing trends in the field of missions, American-Chinese relations, and the work of the Price family through three generations.

The first 7 boxes of the collection comprise the General Materials series. The General Materials series includes correspondence, newspaper clippings, article clippings, small pamphlets and booklets, programmes, and other assorted materials arranged chronologically by year. The Religious Materials collection, Box 8, includes materials relating to the "Good Samaritan Fund," sermon and service materials, and manuscripts for religious articles and books. The Writings and Articles series, Box 9, includes articles written not only by P. Frank Price but also includes copies of articles and manuscripts written by Dr. P. Frank Price's son, Dr. Frank W. Price. In addition to the actual writings of members of the Price family, Box 9 also includes background and research material concerning Japanese Militarism and material on China in the 1930's and 1940's. The Family and Funeral materials series, Boxes 10 and 11, include notes on the Price family as well as the Wilson family. This series includes letters and materials relating to P. Frank Price and Esther W. Price's early lives. The funeral materials in this series include general funeral materials used by Dr. Price in his ministerial capacity and materials relating specifically to Esther W. Price's funeral in 1950 and Dr. P. Frank Price's funeral in 1954. The Miscellaneous Materials series, Boxes 12 and 13, includes various materials on Asia and China, particularly copies of the Nanking Notes and Notices bulletin, materials from Nanking Theological Seminary and Converse College, and assorted photographs (Box 12). Box 14 includes Dr. P. Frank Price's postal card collection and a nearly complete collection of the "Circle Letters" arranged chronologically (1928-1954). Box 15 houses a sermon note collection used by P. Frank Price. The Journal Collection, Box 16, includes memo books detailing expenses, etc. and religious notes. The Diary Collection, Boxes 17 and 18, includes diaries kept by P. Frank Price from 1940-1948 and 1950-1952. Also included in Box 18 are two diaries detailing the anniversary of Mrs. Esther W. Price's 80th Birthday celebrations in 1946.

The P. Frank Price collection not only covers a large span of time but also covers a large range of interests and participants. The collection gives a good insight into the reality of life in China for Westerners and Chinese alike from Imperial days to the establishment of Communist China. The collection includes such topics as the period of the Warlords, the Tokyo Earthquake of 1923, the rioting against foreigners in Nanking in 1927, the Japanese invasions of Manchuria and mainland China, and the struggle between the Nationalist government of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek and the Chinese Communists. The collection contains correspondence with Chiang Kai-shek and Madame Chiang, Presidents Roosevelt and Eisenhower, and other notables.

The collection is not limited to correspondence and materials relating solely to Dr. P. Frank Price. The collection is really a "family collection" relating to the entire Price family, many of whom were intimately involved with work in the Far East. There are materials relating to P. Frank Price's sons Frank W. and Essie and M. Price, Harry and Betty Price, Julian and Clara Price, Philip and Octavia Price, Mrs. Rebecca Wilson (Esther W. Price's sister), and other family members. Therefore the only real weakness of the collection remains its sheer breadth and complexity of events.
